THIS PRIVATE AGREEMENT IS MADE ON 14 DAY OF MARCH 2018.

BETWEEN

(a) The "**Alexander S. Onassis Public Benefit Foundation**" with headquarters in Vaduz, Liechtenstein, at 27, Städtle str. represented herein by Messrs. F. Hadgiantoniou (hereinafter referred to as "**the Foundation**"),

AND

(hereinafter referred to as "**the Fellowship Recipient**"),

collectively hereinafter referred to as "**the Parties**".

The Parties have agreed and mutually accepted the following:

1. The Fellowship Recipient will receive a **Category E** fellowship approved by the Board of Directors of the Foundation, under the terms and conditions of the Onassis Program for International Scholars' Regulations

as those included “Cat. A document” as already notified to the Fellowship Recipient and the latter has read and fully accepted them.

2. The grant is valid for a period of **six [6] months** with the purpose of conducting research in Greece for the successful completion of the research project entitled

«...**A Study on Scarabs from the Rhodian *Aegyptiaca*.....**». The project is carried out in collaboration with the (*NAME OF THE COLLABORATING UNIVERSITY OR INSTITUTION*): ...UNIVERSITY OF THE AEGEAN – DEPARTMENT OF MEDITERRANEAN STUDIES (RHODES)..... (hereinafter referred to as "**the Institution**") within the academic year 2016 – 2017. The use of the grant cannot be deferred for any other academic year and its duration cannot be extended under any circumstances.

3. The grant covers:

(a) travel expenses in the form of a round trip **air-ticket** (economy class) up to three hundred euro [**€ 300**] from and to the place of his/her permanent residence; and

(b) living expenses in the form of a **monthly allowance** of one thousand five hundred euro [**€ 1.500**].

4. The first monthly allowance will be credited to the Fellowship recipient’s bank account upon her/his arrival in Greece, providing the Department of the Onassis Fellowships Program for International Scholars at least one (1) month former to arrival date has been duly informed of:

- the fellowship start date; and
- bank account details of the Fellowship Recipient (Beneficiary, Bank, IBAN, Account number, swift number for the U.S.A.) in her/his country of permanent residency.

The total granted amount of **nine thousand three hundred euro (€ 9.300)** will be deposited to the Fellowship recipient account, apart from the first one as described hereinabove, in five (5) equal installments. The Fellowship Recipient will be receiving the amount of €1.500 within the first ten (10) days of each calendar month, provided she/he has submitted the monthly activities report as mentioned in par. 8 hereinunder until the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the prior month at the latest.

The Foundation will under no circumstances be required to pay any additional amount in order to cover any expenses pertaining to the whole spectrum of the Fellowship the above-mentioned amount being absolutely limited to such.

With regard to the refunding of the travel expenses up to one thousand euro [€1.000] for a long distance flight or three hundred euro [€300] for an European country, the Fellowship Recipient is obliged to submit proper invoices/receipts of the cost of travel and boarding passes in order to claim reimbursement of the travel expenses.

5. The Fellowship Recipient must obtain health coverage under a recognized health insurance agency prior to the commencement of his/her research under this Agreement. The Fellowship recipient will need to submit proof of health insurance coverage upon the first meeting with the Onassis Fellowship Program's coordinator.

6. The Fellowship Recipient is bound to remain in Greece for the period of the fellowship. If the curriculum requires the Fellowship Recipient to travel to another country for participation to a colloquium, it is necessary to timely inform the coordinator of the Onassis Fellowship Program for International Scholars of the exact dates and topic of the congress. In any case the Fellowship Recipient cannot be away from Greece for more than three (3) days. In case he/she exceeds the aforementioned period, the period of his/her fellowship in Greece shall be extended accordingly.

7. The Fellowship Recipient declares that she/he shall fulfill the following requirements:

(a) Teaching activities of the Fellowship Recipient through **lessons/seminars** in the specific field of research, as invitee of the Institute and its scientific collaborator(s). This activities must be part of the Institute's curriculum and be organized in collaboration with the coordinator of the Onassis Fellowships Program for International Scholars.



More specifically the Fellowship Recipient must complete the following activities during the duration of her/his fellowship:

(b) The Fellowship Recipient is bound to publish a scientific article or chapter in a collective work, a monograph or a book, dealing with findings derived from the research granted by the Foundation, within a period of twenty four (24) months from the completion of the fellowship.

(c) The Fellowship Recipient will be invited, on a case by case basis, to deliver a lecture during her/his stay in Greece. The place and time will be decided in collaboration with the coordinator of the Onassis Fellowships Program for International Scholars.

8. The Fellowship recipient is required to submit monthly progress reports on the research project, the benefits of the scientific collaboration and the teaching activities until the 25<sup>th</sup> day of each calendar month the latest.

9. The Institute's scientific collaborator (s) of the Fellowship Recipient is bound to send to the Onassis Foundation, at the end of the fellowship, a final progress report with which he/she shall describe the benefits of the scientific collaboration with the Fellowship Recipient.

10. The Fellowship Recipient should state his/her capacity as an international Onassis fellow in any written work (i.e. essay, article etc.) or interview/presentation relating to the project for which he/she received the fellowship. The Fellowship recipient is expected to state his/her title as Fellows of the Onassis Foundation on his/her CV.

11. During the term of the present fellowship the Fellowship Recipient cannot receive a fellowship from another institution, foundation or entity of any kind having similar or the same scopes with the Foundation.

12. The Fellowship Recipient is required to devote the necessary time and attention to her/his research. Failure to do so may result to the discontinuation of the fellowship.



13. Any change occurring during the period of the Fellowship must be communicated to the coordinator of the Onassis Fellowships Program for International Scholars [tel.: 0030 2103713018, e-mail: [fhadgiantoniou.ffp@onassis.org](mailto:fhadgiantoniou.ffp@onassis.org)] with whom the Fellowship Recipient can communicate during working hours 09.00am-05.00pm and from Monday to Friday.

14. FELLOWSHIP RECIPIENT FURTHER ACTIONS: Fellowship Recipient is invited during the fellowship to participate and contribute with his/her presence, possibly also with interviews, to non-profit actions of the Foundation and its Scholars' Association, as long as they are related to their field of research.

Furthermore, the Fellowship Recipient is invited to participate in the Foundation's publicity actions designed to enhance the international fellowship program of the Foundation and its importance in the context of education today.

In order to enhance the program and showcase its scope, the Fellowship recipient may be asked, on a case to case basis, to share samples of his/her work and teaching activities through the Foundation website. These samples can include the podcast of a lecture, research posters in .pdf format and a short interview in English. The contribution of the Fellowship Recipient will be highly appreciated.

15. The Fellowship Recipient agrees to act in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Program as Known to him/her. Failure to comply with those and/or the terms of this Agreement constitutes a breach of this Agreement by the Fellowship Recipient and will result in immediate termination of this Agreement without notice by the Foundation.


16. This Agreement constitutes the entirety of the agreement between the Parties hereof and supersedes any other previous agreement, understanding or representation, whether written or oral, between them.

17. All of the terms of this Agreement are deemed to be equally material and each one of them constitutes a contractual foundation of this Agreement.

18. Each of the Parties agree herein that it will not disclose to any third party the content of this Agreement as well as any confidential information that was exchanged within the scope of it.

19. This Agreement is governed by the Law of the Principality of Liechtenstein and any dispute hereunder will be brought before the Competent Courts of Vaduz, Liechtenstein.

This Private Agreement was drawn up in two (2) original copies, one for each party.
